From being a bitter enemy of Christ, Saul of Tarsus, the persecutor of Christians, became on the road to Damascus Paul the Apostle, who for love of Christ, was to throw himself into the task of converting the Gentiles. Says St. Ambrose: All nations were to learn through him that Jesus is the Son of God and Savior of the world.

A Note on the Vestibule Remodel

A number of people have inquired about the financing of the remodel of the vestibule of the church and its effect on the Capital Campaign. The monies for the remodel have not come from the Capital Campaign fund which is set aside solely for the purchase of property and the building of a new church. The Building Fund is paying for the vestibule remodel, an inexpensive project which is being done in order to achieve cohesion between the vestibule and the sanctuary.

The Building Fund has been in existence since Mater Dei became a parish for the purpose of upkeep and maintenance of the current facility and property; which we will continue to do until such time as the new church is built – an unknown number of years from now.

PLEASE NOTE THAT, in order to contribute to the Capital Campaign fund, a parishioner must have a pledge in place. If you have questions about your pledge or wish to make one, simply contact the office and we can help you. Otherwise any money earmarked to the Building Fund without a pledge in place will go to the upkeep and maintenance of the current facility. The Capital Campaign donations are free from assessment by the Diocese, while the Building Fund donations are partially assessable.
