St. Peter Claver, Confessor, III Class

Born in Spain in 1584, he would spend 27 years in unflagging devotedness to the African slaves in South America. Called the "Slave of the slaves," nearly three hundred thousand of them received baptism at his hands. He welcomed them on their arrival, instructed them, gave them alms, and nursed them in any sort of malady. St. Alphonsus Rodriguez, contemporary and canonized with St. Peter Claver, had received a revelation of the apostolic career of Peter and the incomparable glory reserved for him in heaven. He died September 8, 1654 and canonized by Leo XIII in 1888.

TUESDAY - September 10 - White - St. Nicholas of Tolentino, Confessor, III Class

St. Nicholas received his baptismal name of the holy bishop of Myra because he was born after a pilgrimage made by his parents to the tomb of the great miracle-worker. Following the example of his holy patron, although only seven years old, he fasted several times during the week. He would give up all his possessions and enter the Order of Hermits of St. Augustine. Represented holding a lily, he was a model of innocence and purity. He died in 1308.

In accordance with the Jewish custom, our Lady's parents named her eight days after her birth and were inspired to call her Mary. The feast originated in Spain and was approved by the Holy See in 1513 and extended to the universal Church in 1683 by Pope Innocent XI in thanksgiving to our Lady for the victory over the Muslim Turks on Vienna.

This feast was originally celebrated solely to honor the anniversary of the discovery of the Cross by St. Helena and the dedication of the basilicas consecrated at Jerusalem on September 14, 335 on the sites of the Holy Sepulchre and Calvary. At a later date, however, some confusion about the object of the celebration caused the day to be regarded as the commemoration of another event – the return of the Holy Cross by the Persians in 629. It had been carried off in 614 on the occasion of a Persian victory and brought back in triumph by the Emperor Heraclius who had defeated the Persian armies.


