One of the great Popes of the third century, as a deacon he was given the task of administering Church property and preserving the bodies of the martyrs. He became Pope in 217 and died in 222 in an affray with the Jews.

TUESDAY, October 15 (White) St. Teresa of Avila, Virgin, III Class

Born in Avila, Spain, she entered the local Carmelites at eighteen and, after many difficulties, succeeded in reforming the convent. With the help of St. John of the Cross, she would reform most of the convents of the Carmelite order and found many new ones. In meditation, she was one of only a few saints to reach the highest degree of mysticism. Her writings on the spiritual life have been revered through the ages and she would be proclaimed a doctor of the Church by Paul VI. She died in 1582.

The maternal aunt of St. Elizabeth of Hungary, upon the death of her husband, Henry I, Duke of Poland, she renounced the world and entered a Cistercian monastery where her daughter was the abbess. She died October 15, 1243 and is honored as the patroness of Poland.

THURSDAY, October 17 (White) St. Margaret Mary Alacoque, Virgin, III Class

A Visitation nun, St. Margaret Mary was the chosen instrument of our Lord to remind the world of His love. The three great revelations she had in the chapel of her monastery are the origin of the great development of devotion to the Sacred Heart. She died October 17, 1690 after a life of great penance.

FRIDAY, October 18 (Red) St. Luke the Evangelist, II Class

Writer of the third Gospel and book of Acts, he came from Antioch, was one of the first converts to Christianity, and accompanied St. Paul on his missionary journeys. Nothing is known of his last years, although the Church venerates him as a martyr. His Gospel is principally concerned with salvation and mercy, containing the parables of the lost sheep and prodigal son.

Son of noble parents, he would give away in alms all his possessions and become a Franciscan at age 16. He was the spiritual director of St. Teresa of Avila and died in 1562.

Due to the overwhelming interest in the Pontifical Mass (followed by installation of the Blessed Karl Shrine), at 9:00 am on October 20, 2019, we will institute the following procedures:

- The front pews in the sanctuary will continue to be used by the elderly and the handicapped.
- The second rows will be reserved for the Blessed Karl Event speakers and their guests
- **The 11:30 am Mass on that day is cancelled**
- Due to the length of the Mass (approximately 3-4 hours) we strongly recommend that parents with children under the age of 10 attend a different Mass that day.
- There will be overflow seating in the Parish Hall
- For security reasons, the ushers will clear the entire sanctuary after the 7:00 am Mass is over, before admitting Pontifical Mass attendees. No pews will be held with personal items and no seats can be reserved.
