Foundress of the Missionary Sisters of the Sacred Heart, she devoted herself especially to work for the unprotected young and for the Italian immigrants in the US, founding for them schools and hospitals, and became known as their Mother. She was canonized by Pius XII in 1946 who praised her as having the meekness and humility of Christ, mistrust of self which led to boundless confidence in God, an intense union with the Heart of our Lord, and a rare intensity of her interior life that matched the extreme external activity of her existence. She died December 22, 1917 and , as a naturalized American, is considered the first saint of the United States.
