St. Matthew was a tax collector for the Romans and so his profession was hateful to the Jews because it reminded them of their subjection, and he was regarded as a typical sinner by the Pharisees. Called by our Lord, he would leave all and follow Him. St. Matthew was the first to put down in writing our Lord's teaching and the account of His life, writing his Gospel in Aramaic, the language our Lord spoke Himself. He would suffer martyrdom as did the other Apostles.

Born in Spain in the fifteenth century, St. Thomas felt a tender compassion for the poor from his earliest years. He joined the hermits of St. Augustine and soon became the superior. Forced to accept the archbishopric of Valencia, he devoted the great revenues of his see to the poor; before his death, he had given away his last penny and did not even own the bed he died on.

For this reason, the Church invokes her intercession in the prayers for a departing soul.
