Wednesday, Nov. 4, White—St. Charles Borromeo, Patron of Seminarians, Bishop and Confessor, III Class

St. Charles was one of the chief instruments of reformation of the Church in the 16th century. It was largely owing to his wisdom that the Council of Trent was happily concluded. Born in 1538 and made a Cardinal at the age of 21, he soon became archbishop of Milan. He held synods and councils, established colleges and communities, renewed the spirit of his clergy and of monasteries, and founded diocesan seminaries, the rules of which were adopted everywhere. He died in 1584 and was canonized in 1610.


