His mystical writings have earned him the title of Doctor of the contemplative life. He died in 1591 and proclaimed Doctor in 1926.




In charity and for the protection of our priests and all others, please do not come to the parish if you are exhibiting any signs of being sick.

All children 14 years and younger must be accompanied by a parent or older sibling while on Mater Dei property.


