As we are reminded by the Gospel of this Mass, St. Andrew, the brother of Simon Peter, was the first Apostle called by our Lord. At Christ's call, he left his nets straightway and followed Him to become a "fisher of men." Little is known of St. Andrew's subsequent apostolic career. The old accounts of his martyrdom depict him crucified on two beams fastened together in the form of an "x" and contain beautiful passages on fidelity to Christ and love of the Cross; for this reason St. Andrew has become known in Christian devotion as the Apostle of the Cross

She died in 363.

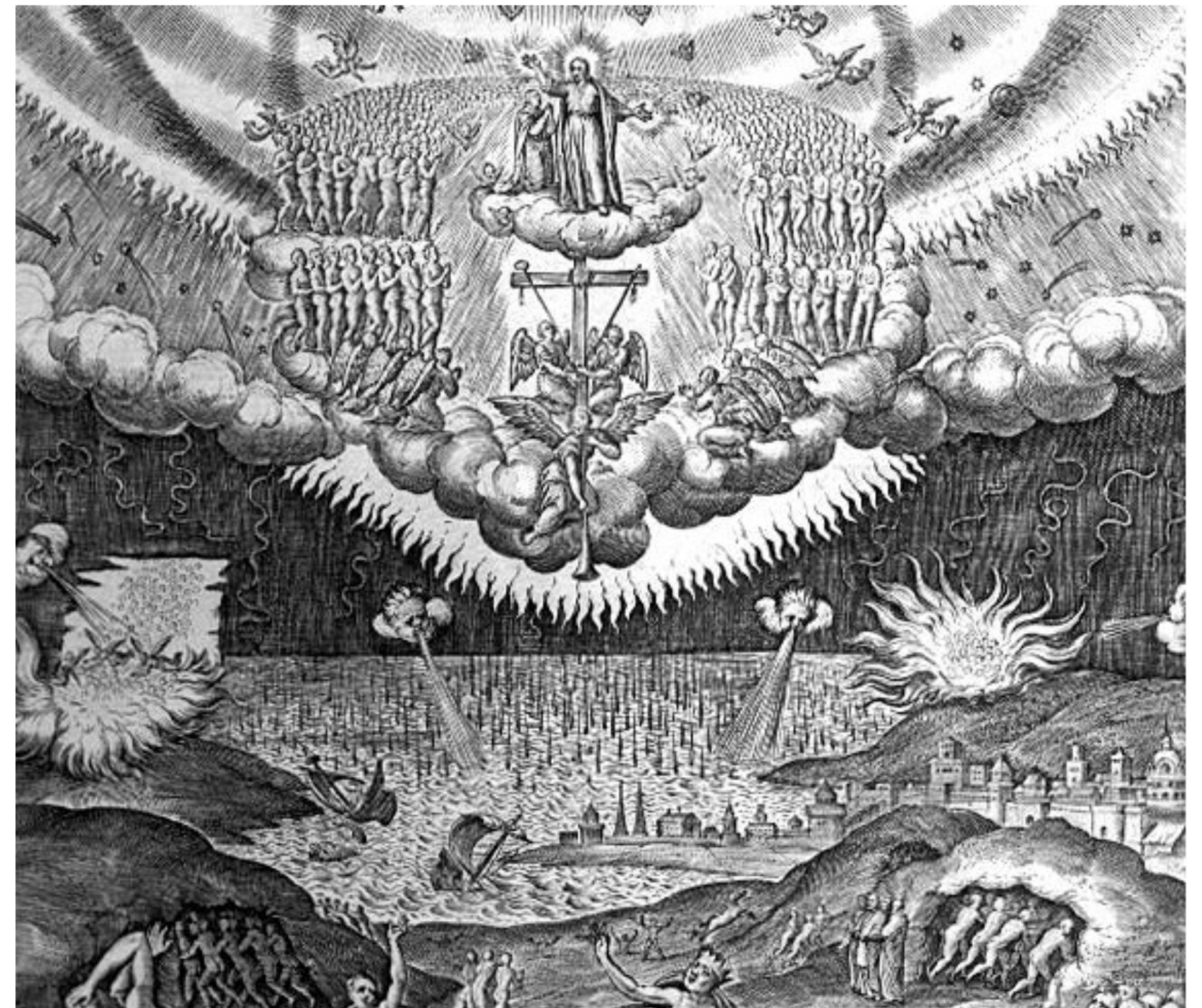

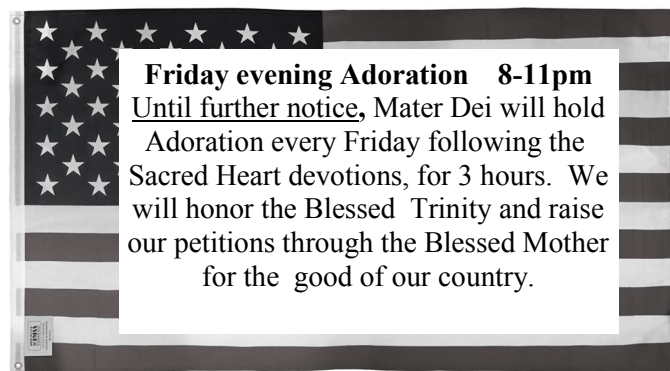

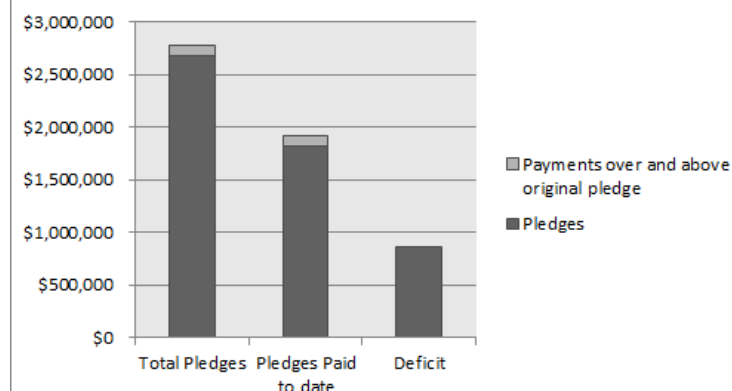


Our Lady of Guadalupe Feast Celebration December 12th

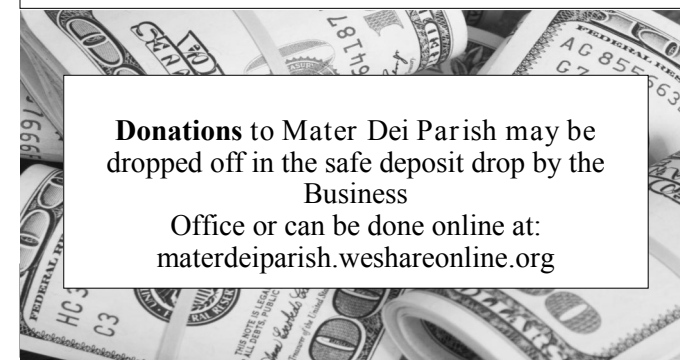
