St. Nazarius, baptized by St. Linus, in his turn baptized young Celsus. They were beheaded at Milan in 68. In 395, their bodies were discovered and in the tomb of St. Nazarius was found a phial of his blood as red as if it had been shed that very day. Also remembered is Pope St. Victor I, who fixed the date of Easter as it is now, being the Sunday after the first full moon after the vernal equinox. He was martyred in 202. And also Pope St. Innocent I, a contemporary of St. Augustine and St. Jerome, who died in 417. No Mass, No Confessions

Born in Loyola, Spain in 1491, he first took up a military career. A serious injury confined him to a hospital, where he began reading Scripture and the lives of the saints. His faith reawakened, he realized his divine calling, laid his sword at our Lady's feet in the Benedictine Abbey at Montserrat, and set out to establish the Society of Jesus, which was raised up by Providence to combat Protestantism and resurgent paganism. He destined his followers to a militant life and, to maintain the intense spiritual life which this required, he organized a well-organized form of government and a masterly treatis, highly approved by the Church, known as the Spiritual Exercises, which have been the means of sanctification for thousands of souls. 
