The Church celebrates today with great joy our Lady's immediate entry, body and soul, into the glory of heaven, giving praise to her in whom the Redemption was fully effective without restriction, since, before all the other saints, she was privileged to enjoy the resurrection of the body, following the example of the Risen Christ Himself. A great sign appeared in heaven; the Mass of this feast, introduced by Pius XII after the definition of the dogma on November 1, 1950, sees in the woman portrayed in the Apocalypse, clothed with the sun, the moon under her feet and on her head a crown of twelve stars the glorified Mother of God in the full radiance of her eternal glory.

Monday, Aug. 16 - St. Joachim, Father of the Blessed Virgin Mary, Confessor, II Class, White

Desiring to associate St. Joachim with the triumph of his blessed daughter, St. Pius X transferred his feast from March 20, on which it used to be kept, to August 16, the day after the Assumption. In Hebrew the name Joachim means "preparation of the Lord." The Gospel sets out the genealogy according to St. Matthew. The divine preparation was begun far back and runs through the history of the whole chosen people, to find its completion in our Lady, of whom was born Jesus Christ. The feast of St. Joachim, like that of St. Anne, should help us to venerate all the righteous of the Old Testament, whose lives were passed in preparation and waiting for the coming of the Messias.

Tuesday, Aug. 17 - St. Hyacinth, Confessor, 3rd Class, White

Called the Apostle of the North, St. Hyacinth was born in 1185. He was received into the Dominican order by St. Dominic. In 1218, he was made superior of the mission which the saint sent to Poland; from there, he traveled through Austria, Denmark, Scotland, and Livonia, his preaching confirmed by numerous miracles. He died August 15, 1257.

Born in France on November 14, 1601, he would found the Congregation of Jesus and Mary in 1643 and the Congregation of the Sisters of Charity of Our Lady in 1644. Renowned as a preacher and ascetic writer, he promoted the public worship of the Sacred Hearts of Jesus and Mary. He died August 19, 1690 and canonized in 1925.

Friday, Aug. 20 - St. Bernard, Abbot & Doctor, III Class, White

Born in 1090, he founded a monasteries at Citeaux and Clairvaux under the Cisterian discipline, a form of Benedictines. An austere monk, a great orator, and learned doctor, his teaching enlightened Europe in the twelfth century. Pope Eugenius III received his monastic training from St. Bernard and sought his counsel through his pontificate. A staunch defender of the faith against heresy, St. Bernard preached the second crusade against Islam. He died in 1153.

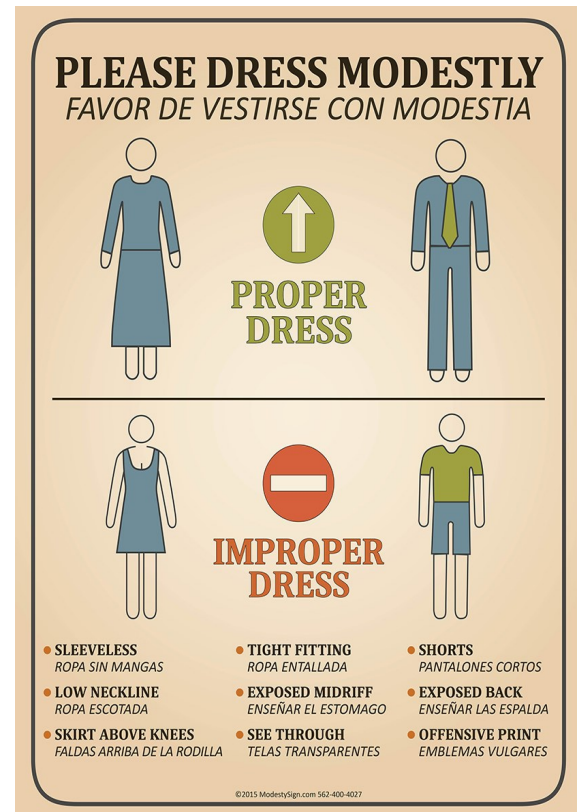
