Called the "Slave of the slaves," nearly three hundred thousand of them received baptism at his hands. He welcomed them on their arrival, instructed them, gave them alms, and nursed them in any sort of malady. St. Alphonsus Rodriguez, contemporary and canonized with St. Peter Claver, had received a revelation of the apostolic career of Peter and the incomparable glory reserved for him in heaven. He died September 8, 1654 and canonized by Leo XIII in 1888. Following the example of his holy patron, although only seven years old, he fasted several times during the week. He would give up all his possessions and enter the Order of Hermits of St. Augustine.
