As we are reminded by the Gospel of this Mass, St. Andrew, the brother of Simon Peter, was the first Apostle called by our Lord. At Christ's call, he left his nets straightway and followed Him to become a "fisher of men." Little is known of St. Andrew's subsequent apostolic career. The old accounts of his martyrdom depict him crucified on two beams fastened together in the form of an "X" and contain beautiful passages on fidelity to Christ and love of the Cross; for this reason St. Andrew has become known in Christian devotion as the Apostle of the Cross.

St. Bibiana (Vivian), together with SS. Agnes and Cecilia, is one of the virgin martyrs held in particular veneration in Rome. With unshakeable firmness she resisted the efforts made to pervert her; she was tied to a column and beaten to death with scourges loaded with lead adding thus the crown of martyrdom to that of virginity. She died in 363.

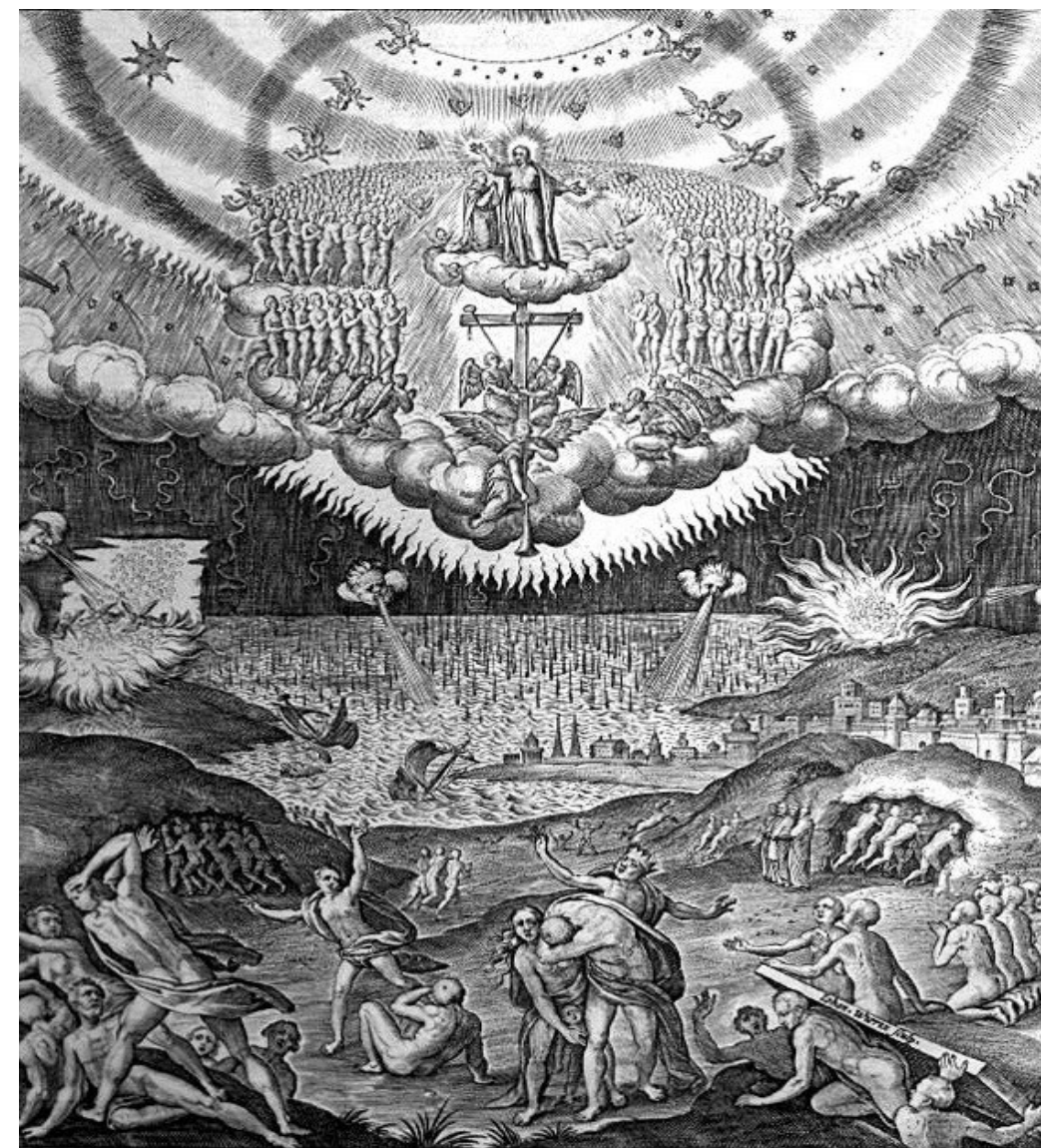

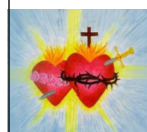

**Plenary Indulgences for the Faithful Departed**

The normal November 1-8 Plenary Indulgence for the deceased faithful has been extended for the entire month of November by a decree from the Vatican dated October 27, 2021.

Additionally, the Plenary Indulgence reserved for All Souls Day can be obtained on any day in November.

"a -The Plenary Indulgence for those who visit a cemetery and pray for the deceased, even if only mentally, normally established only on the individual days from 1 to 8 November, may be transferred to other days of the same month, until its end. These days, freely chosen by the individual believers, may also be separate from each other

b- the Plenary Indulgence of 2 November, established on the occasion of the Commemoration of all the deceased faithful for those who piously visit a church or oratory and recite the "Our Father" and the "Creed" there, may be transferred not only to the Sunday before or after or on the day of the Solemnity of All Saints, but also to another day of the month of November, freely chosen by the individual faithful."

The normal conditions apply to receive the indulgence:

- confession\*
- communion\*
- pray for the Holy Father's intentions
- detachment from sin

\*It is ideal if confession and communion take place on the day of the indulgenced act, but it is sufficient if they are carried out several days (about 10) before or after
