One of the most famous and venerated of Roman martyrs, her body was discovered in 822 and transferred to the church that bears her name in Rome. It is difficult to determine when she lived, although some accounts place her martyrdom during the pontificate of Urban I (222-230). She is the patroness of musicians.

Tuesday, November 23 - St. Clement I, Pope & Martyr, III Class, Red

The third successor of St. Peter, he governed the Church from A.D. 88 to 97. He is listed in the canon of the Mass and is an author of a pastoral letter to the Corinthians, one of the oldest extant documents of the Church, which is imbued throughout with a great love of Christian unity. Wednesday, November 24 – St. John of the Cross, Doctor, III Class, White

One of the greatest masters of the spiritual life, he entered the Carmelites in Salamanca and collaborated with St. Teresa of Avila in the reform of the order. He was a man of complete self-renunciation with a great love of the Cross, making of austerity the indispensable condition of a life given to prayer. His mystical writings have earned him the title of Doctor of the contemplative life. He died in 1591 and proclaimed Doctor in 1926.

Thursday, November 25 – St. Catherine of Alexandria, Patroness of Philosophers, Virgin & Martyr, III Class, Red

St. Catherine had been venerated at the monastery on Mt. Sinai when, in the fifteenth century, the monks discovered her body. Legend has made of her a young Christian of Alexandria (Egypt) who rejected the advances of Emperor Maximinus and routed a meeting of learned men gathered together to induce her to deny Christ. Friday, November 26 - St. Sylvester, Abbot - III Class, White

Born of noble parents, when present one day at the funeral of an illustrious man, a relative of his, he was struck by the hideous appearance of the body of one who had been so handsome. He left all and retired to the desert where he practiced penance and meditation and eventually founded the Congregation of the Sylvestrines under the Benedictine rule. He died at ninety years of age in 1267.

Plenary Indulgences for the Faithful Departed

The normal November 1-8 Plenary Indulgence for the deceased faithful has been extended for the entire month of November by a decree from the Vatican dated October 27, 2021.

Additionally, the Plenary Indulgence reserved for All Souls Day can be obtained on any day in November.

"a -The Plenary Indulgence for those who visit a cemetery and pray for the deceased, even if only mentally, normally established only on the individual days from 1 to 8 November, may be transferred to other days of the same month, until its end. These days, freely chosen by the individual believers, may also be separate from each other

b- the Plenary Indulgence of 2 November, established on the occasion of the Commemoration of all the deceased faithful for those who piously visit a church or oratory and recite the "Our Father" and the "Creed" there, may be transferred not only to the Sunday before or after or on the day of the Solemnity of All Saints, but also to another day of the month of November, freely chosen by the individual faithful."

The normal conditions apply to receive

the indulgence:

-confession*

-communion*

-pray for the Holy Father's intentions

-detachment from sin

*It is ideal if confession and communion take place on the day of the indulgenced act, but it is sufficient if they are carried out several days (about 10) before or after
