The Church of the Lateran in Rome is one of the first basilicas consecrated for Christian worship under the Emperor Constantine. It was attached to the palace of the Lateran, where the Popes lived, and so it became the cathedral of the bishops of Rome and, as such, the mother church of all the churches in the world.

Wednesday, November 10–St. Andrew Avellino, Confessor- III Class, White

St. Andrew joined the Theatines and was known for his tremendous love of the Cross. Having become the superior of the institute, he devoted all his free time to prayer and the care of souls. He died in Naples at a very advanced age in 1608, at the foot of the altar as he was about to celebrate Mass.

Thursday, November 11– St. Martin of Tours, Bishop, III Class, White

Born in Pannonia, he came to Gaul (France) as a soldier. At 18, he was baptized, became a disciple of St. Hilary of Portiers, built the first monastery in Gaul, and was later made bishop of Tours, where he built another abbey. He died November 8. 397, his tomb becoming famous through many miracles and attracting large pilgrimages. He is the first bishop honored by the Church in the West.

Saturday, November 13- St. Didacus, Confessor, St. Frances Xavier Cabrini, III Class, White

Foundress of the Missionary Sisters of the Sacred Heart, she devoted herself especially to work for the unprotected young and for the Italian immigrants in the US, founding for them schools and hospitals, and became known as their Mother. She was canonized by Pius XII in 1946 who praised her as having the meekness and humility of Christ, mistrust of self which led to boundless confidence in God, an intense union with the Heart of our Lord, and a rare intensity of her interior life that matched the extreme external activity of her existence. She died December 22, 1917 and, as a naturalized American, is considered the first saint of the United States.

The normal November 1-8 Plenary Indulgence for the deceased faithful has been extended for the entire month of November by a decree from the Vatican dated October 27, 2021.

Additionally, the Plenary Indulgence reserved for All Souls Day can be obtained on any day in November.

"a -The Plenary Indulgence for those who visit a cemetery and pray for the deceased, even if only mentally, normally established only on the individual days from 1 to 8 November, may be transferred to other days of the same month, until its end. These days, freely chosen by the individual believers, may also be separate from each other

b- the Plenary Indulgence of 2 November, established on the occasion of the Commemoration of all the deceased faithful for those who piously visit a church or oratory and recite the "Our Father" and the "Creed" there, may be transferred not only to the Sunday before or after or on the day of the Solemnity of All Saints, but also to another day of the month of November, freely chosen by the individual faithful."

The normal conditions apply to receive the indulgence:

- confession*
 - communion*
 - pray for the Holy Father's intentions
 - detachment from sin
- *It is ideal if confession and communion take place on the day of the indulgenced act, but it is sufficient if they are carried out several days (about 10) before or after
