God glorified him with endless miracles. He was made bishop of Myra, took part in the council of Nicea, and died in 324.

Wednesday, December 8–Holy Day of Obligation-Immaculate Conception of the Blessed Virgin Mary, I Class, White

Almighty God, having decided from all eternity to make Mary the Mother of the Word Incarnate clothed her with the robe of holiness and made her soul a dwelling worthy of His Son. That complete Redemption which, from the moment of her conception, preserved our Lady from original sin, must not be considered apart from our own redemption by Christ. Occurring in Advent, this feast heralds the wonders of the Incarnation, by which Redemption came to the world. This feast was instituted by Bl. Pius IX when the dogma was defined on December 8, 1854; the solemn definition, spurred by our Lady’s appearance at Lourdes, was an assertion of the constant faith of the Church and a statement of the Church’s precise belief in this matter.

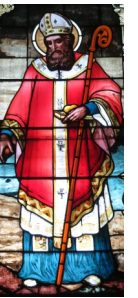
Class will be held on Dec. 12th after all Masses in the St Columban room.
