The word Epiphany means manifestation. The Church in the Mass over the next two weeks commemorates a triple manifestation of Christ: today, to the Magi who represent the Gentiles, and by whose gifts the Child is honored as King (gold) and High Priest (frankincense) who will redeem man from sin by way of His death (myrrh); on January 13, in His Baptism, when the voice from Heaven declared: "This is My beloved Son"; and on the second Sunday after the Epiphany in the miracle of changing water into wine at Cana.

January 5

The Epiphany Water blessing will take place on January 5th at 7pm; the blessing lasts about 45 minutes and will not be followed by Vespers.

You must be present to have any water you bring blessed.

For the blessing, the faithful will process up to the communion rail to have their water blessed.

You may only get blessed what you can carry in each hand; water must be in containers that are between one quart minimum and one gallon maximum.

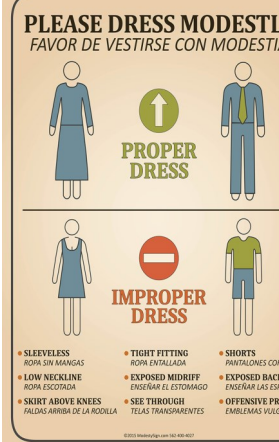
