From being a bitter enemy of Christ, Saul of Tarsus, the persecutor of Christians, became on the road to Damascus Paul the Apostle, who for love of Christ, was to throw himself into the task of converting the Gentiles. Of incredible intellect, his powerful eloquence earned him the surname Chrysostom, meaning "golden mouth." With St. Athanasius, Gregory Nazienzen, and Basil, he forms the group of the four great doctors of the Eastern Church. He died in 407.

Born of noble and wealthy parents in France, he was commissioned by our Lady to found the order of Our Lady of Mercy for the Ransom of Captives. When all the funds of the work were exhausted, the religious were bound by their rule to take the places of the prisoners with the infidels. He died in 1256.
