Monday, January 31 - St. John Bosco, Confessor, III Class, White

Born in 1815 and raised by a saintly mother, he would become a priest and, on account of his tremendous confidence in God, accomplish numerous works in spite of tremendous obstacles. Moved by compassion towards the young, especially of the poorer classes, he founded schools and orphanages and employed all his talents – and sense of humor – in the Christian formation of them. His charity, humility, and kindness were well-known. He died in 1888.

One of the finest examples of a bishop in the early Church, he was condemned to the wild beasts and sent to Rome in chains.

On his way there, he wrote magnificent letters to the churches, exhorting obedience to the Church, and in which his great love of Christ and ardent desire for martyrdom find expression: “I am the wheat of Christ; may I be ground by the fangs of wild beasts and become a bread with no impurity.” He died around 110.

The blessing and procession of candles recalls the manifestation of Christ as the Light of the world, received in the temple by Simeon as God’s messenger: A light of revelation to the Gentiles and a glory for Thy people Israel. It is one of the oldest, if not the oldest, of the Marian feasts.

Boxed candles can be dropped off on tables under the pavilion starting at 6pm on February 2nd. Boxes need to be opened and marked with your last name.

You must take your candles with you when you leave; remaining candles will be donated.
