They had worked amidst great privations for the conversion of the Hurons. Taken prisoner by the Iroquois tribe, between 1642 and 1649 they were put to atrocious tortures, which they bore for the love of God. They were canonized by Pius XI.

He was martyred by his pagan brother on September 28, 929, as he was entering a church. St. Wenceslaus is the national hero and patron of Czechoslovakia.

St. Jerome, in search for a perfect form of life, lived for a time as a hermit in the Syrian desert, giving himself up to severe mortification and meditation on Scripture. He is best known for his translation of the Bible and establishing the Latin translation known as the Vulgate, which the Church adopted as her official version. His great learning, commentaries on Scripture, and zeal against the heresies of the time earned him the title of Doctor of the Church.

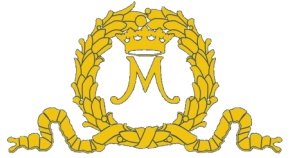

First Confession / First Communion Class Registration

Mater Dei will sponsor a parish catechism class for students who wish to receive the sacraments of Penance and Holy Communion during the 2022-23 school year. The minimum age to attend the class is 6 years old as of October 17, 2022, up to 9 years old. Reception of either sacrament is not required; students may take the class multiple times.

The class will be held on Monday evenings from 5:30-6:30 beginning on Oct. 17, 2022 and ending on June 5, 2023 with breaks for Christmas, Holy Week and Easter. The First Communion Mass for students will be on the Feast of Corpus Christi, June 8, 2023.
