Confirmation 2023

Registration for those wishing to receive the Sacrament of Confirmation in 2023 will take place between October 3rd and Friday of the first week of Advent, December 2, 2022. To register, submit the following as a packet to the office:

- Confirmation registration form. Download at <https://materdeiparish.com/confirmation-reg-form>
- Newly issued baptism certificate.
- Suitability letter for the sponsor, if necessary.

Partial submissions will not be accepted, the form must be filled out completely and all paperwork must be turned in at the same time. Only the parents or legal guardians may register a confirmed. **Reception of the sacrament cannot be guaranteed for those who reside outside of the Dallas Diocese.** While the parent is the primary educator for this sacrament, those wishing to be **Confirmed MUST attend four catechetical sessions conducted by our priests in order to be confirmed.** Catechesis sessions will take place on: January 21, February 18, March 18, and April 29. All Confirmands must show that they are prepared for the sacrament via an interview with a Mater Dei priest, which you will schedule next year. There is a \$20 suggested donation for the class.

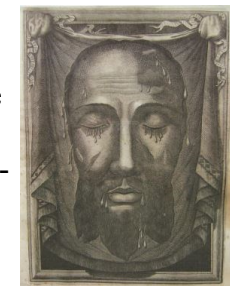
Thanksgiving Dinner Assistance
