We also have 2-3 signup slots for adult/parent volunteers who could help guide a holy hour if a sub is needed. Mrs. Walters would instruct you what to do.

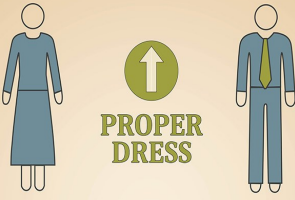
