Fr. Lawrence Carney of the Diocese of Wichita, Kansas will be preaching a mission on The Holy Face. The mission will begin with his sermon at all Sunday Masses, as well as Monday thru Wednesday nights at 6pm Mass followed by a mission talk from 7-8pm. The devotions of the Holy Face of Our Lord were revealed to Sr. Mary of St. Peter (1847) and call to mind the sins which most offend God in our modern times; blasphemy and the profanation of Sunday and Holy Days of obligation. Candle Instructions:

- You must be present to have your candles blessed
- Candles have to be white/unbleached/natural, unscented and at least 51% or more beeswax.
- Boxed candles only can be dropped off on tables starting at 6pm on Feb. 2nd.
- Boxes need to be opened and marked with your last name.
- You must take your candles with you when you leave; remaining candles will be transferred to the Parish Hall for a week.

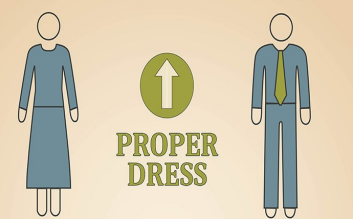
