MDYA Theology on Tap Series: LENT

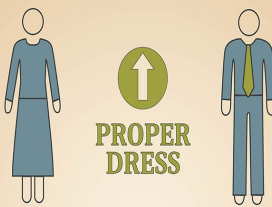
