Thursday, May 25 - St. Gregory VII, Pope & Confessor, III Class, White (Comm. St Urban I)

In the eleventh century, the Church, under the influence of lay princes, was ravaged by serious disorders in the life of the clergy and by simony. Hildebrand, a Roman monk of outstanding character, who had been at Cluny, became, under six successive popes, the instrument and principal agent of reform. Becoming Pope himself, under the name Gregory VII, he openly fought against the abuse of lay investiture (that is, civil rulers choose the bishops), the source of the evils from which the Church was suffering. He gained himself enemies and died in exile in Salerno in 1085, and intrepid defender of the liberty of the Church.

Friday, May 26 - St. Philip Neri, Confessor, III Class, White (Comm. St Eleutherius)

Born in Florence in 1515, St. Phillip Neri lived all his life in Rome and was one of the most influential persons of his time. He was a man of original character and happy disposition, but his soul was burning with an ardent and unbounded love for God and for people of all conditions, with whom he made contact and with whom he led to God, directing and advising them with exceptional sureness of touch. After living as a pilgrim or hermit for 15 years in the streets of Rome, he was ordained a priest at 36 years of age and gathered around himself a group of twenty priests who formed a congregation of secular priests of the Oratory. But St. Phillip's life remained what it always had been, original in character and a very great influence for holiness, which seemed to radiate from him. He died in 1595.
