Having entered the Carmel cloister at Lisieux by special permission at fifteen, she desired by her mortification and self-denial, especially in the little things, to help priests, missionaries, and the whole Church. Wednesday, October 4 - St. Francis of Assisi, Confessor, III Class, White

Son of a rich merchant, St. Francis gave up all his possessions to espouse his “Lady Poverty”, taking the Gospel literally, to embrace a life of evangelical poverty in total destitution but also in the perfect joy of a soul set free. Many others would join him to which he gave a Rule, and then founded with St. Clare the order for women; in 1221, he established a Third Order for the lay, which exerted considerable influence in effecting a renewal of the Christian life among all classes. Granted the gift of the Stigmata, he died on October 4, 1226, his soul being seen as a flash of light ascending to heaven.

Saturday, October 7 - Our Lady of the Rosary, II Class, White

It was customary in the Middle Ages for nobility to wear crowns of flowers as “chaplets.” These crowns were offered to persons of distinction as a sign of reverence. Our Lady has the right to the same homage, and so the Church asks us to offer her a three-fold chaplet, or three crowns of roses, to which she has given the name Rosary. This feast was established to commemorate the victory at Lepanto over the Muslims on October 7, 1571, a favor due to the recitation of the Rosary.

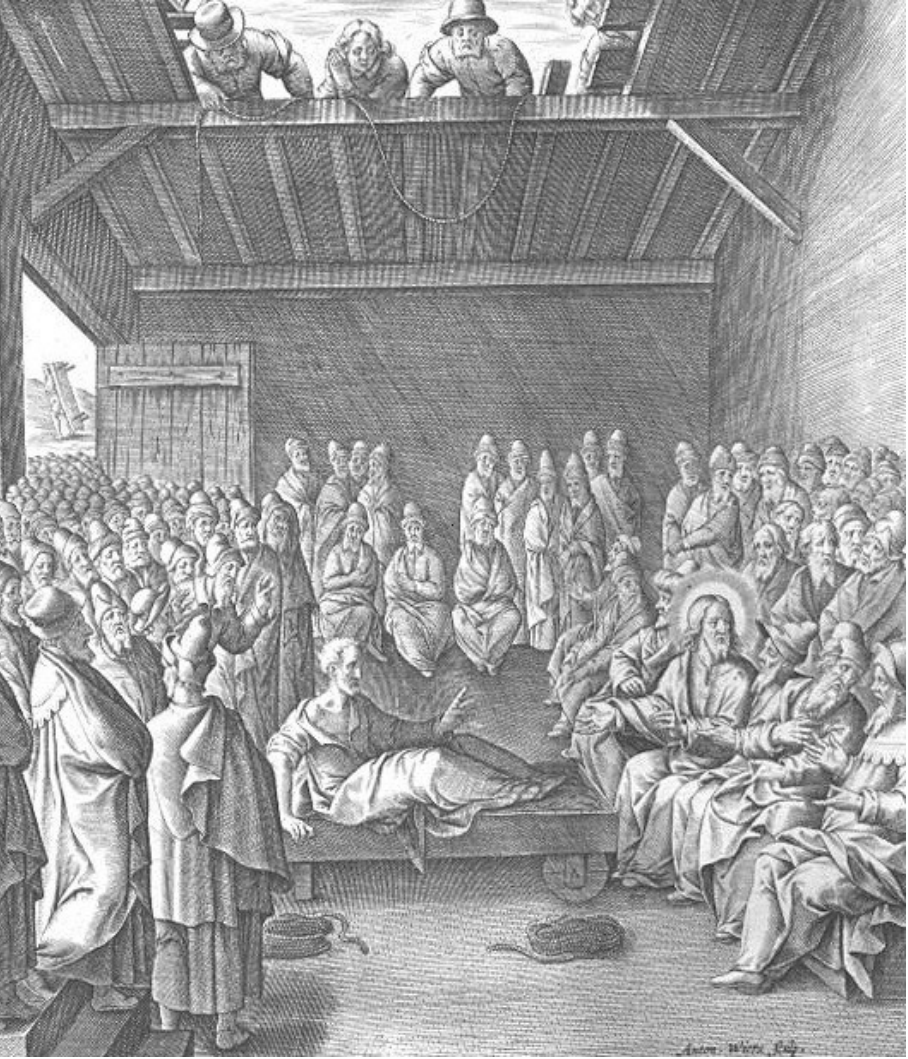

Confirmation Registration

Registrations for youth confirmands will be accepted between October 2 - December 4. This is a hard cutoff date. All paperwork must be completed and submitted by this date for your child to be included in the spring Confirmation group. Youth Confirmations are held once a year during the Vigil of Pentecost Mass. **2024 Confirmations will take place on May 18 at the 5pm Mass.**

Important Notes:

- Only Family members of registered Mater Dei parishioners may receive the Sacrament at the parish.
- Families of confirmands must be registered parishioners for at least a year.
- Only the parents or legal guardians may register a confirmand.
- Reception of the sacrament cannot be guaranteed for those who reside outside of the Dallas Diocese.
- Confirmandi should be in at least the eighth grade, per Diocesan policy.
- Attendance at four priest-led Catechism classes is required; additional catechesis is the responsibility of the parents.
- There is a \$20 suggested donation.
