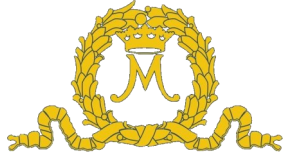

Tuesday, September 12 - The Most Holy Name of Mary, III Class, White

In accordance with the Jewish custom, our Lady's parents named her eight days after her birth and were inspired to call her Mary. The feast originated in Spain and was approved by the Holy See in 1513 and extended to the universal Church in 1683 by Pope Innocent XI in thanksgiving to Our Lady for the victory over the Muslim Turks on Vienna.

Thursday, September 14 - The Exaltation of the Holy Cross, II Class, Red

This feast was originally celebrated solely to honor the anniversary of the discovery of the Cross by St. Helena and the dedication of the basilicas consecrated at Jerusalem on September 14, 335 on the sites of the Holy Sepulchre and Calvary. At a later date, however, some confusion about the object of the celebration caused the day to be regarded as the commemoration of another event – the return of the Holy Cross by the Persians in 629. It had been carried off in 614 on the occasion of a Persian victory and brought back in triumph by the Emperor Heraclius who had defeated the Persian armies.

Saturday, September 16 - Ss. Cornelius, Pope, Cyprian, Bishop, Martyrs, III Class, Red

Pope Cornelius, after a pontificate of two years troubled by a schism of the first anti-pope, Novatian, died in exile in 253. St. Cyprian, a former lawyer, converted and became bishop of Carthage in northern Africa. He loved the Church ardently and fought and suffered for her. In the thick of persecution he encouraged the faithful to face martyrdom and was himself beheaded in 258 on the day Pope Cornelius' relics were transferred to Rome.

Confirmation Registration

Registrations for youth confirmands will be accepted between October 2 - December 4. This is a hard cutoff date. All paperwork must be completed and submitted by this date for your child to be included in the spring Confirmation group. Youth Confirmations are held once a year during the Vigil of Pentecost Mass. **2024 Confirmations will take place on May 18 at the 5pm Mass.**

Important Notes:

- Only Family members of registered Mater Dei parishioners may receive the Sacrament at the parish.
- Families of confirmands must be registered parishioners for at least a year.
- Only the parents or legal guardians may register a confirmand.
- Reception of the sacrament cannot be guaranteed for those who reside outside of the Dallas Diocese.
- Confirmandi should be in at least the eighth grade, per Diocesan policy.
- Attendance at four priest-led Catechism classes is required; additional catechesis is the responsibility of the parents.
- There is a \$20 suggested donation.
