Preferring the austerities of the cloister to a marriage his mother was arranging for him, he entered the Canons Regular of St. George of Alga at age 19. He was made Patriarch of Venice and continued to give the example of an austere life despite the high office. He died in 1455 at 74 years of age.

Saturday, September 9 - St. Peter Claver, Confessor, III Class, White

Born in Spain in 1584, he would spend 27 years in unflagging devotedness to the African slaves in South America. Called the “Slave of the slaves,” nearly three hundred thousand of them received baptism at his hands. He welcomed them on their arrival, instructed them, gave them alms, and nursed them in any sort of malady. St. Alphonsus Rodriguez, contemporary and canonized with St. Peter Claver, had received a revelation of the apostolic career of Peter and the incomparable glory reserved for him in heaven. He died September 8, 1654 and canonized by Leo XIII in 1888.

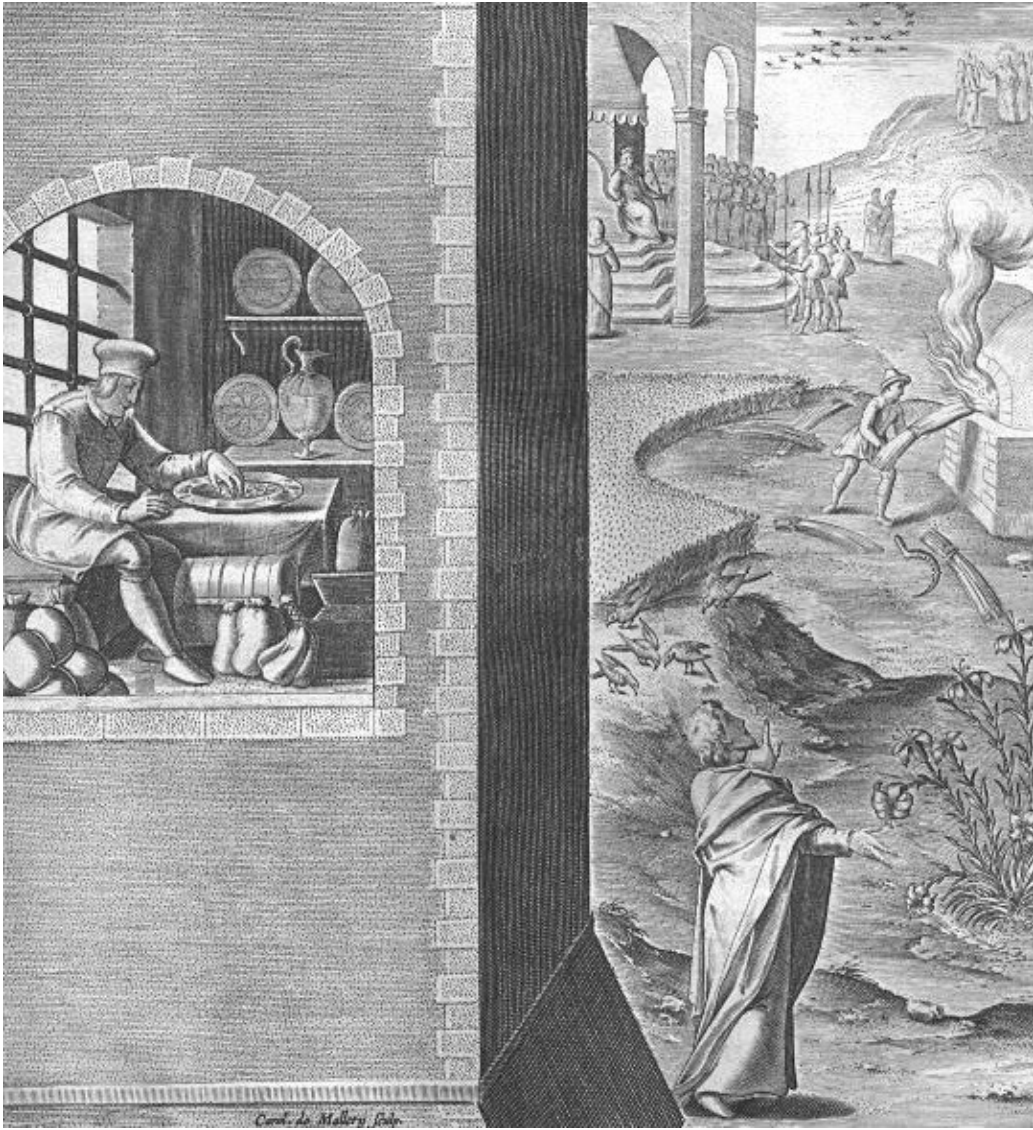
