Candlemas

Mater Dei will celebrate Candlemas on **Friday, February 2nd at 7pm**. A candle blessing will take place in the pavilion, followed by a procession and Sung Mass. Candle guidelines are as follows:

- You must be present to have your candles blessed
- Candles have to be white/unbleached/natural, unscented and 51% beeswax and boxed
- Boxed candles can be dropped off on tables under the pavilion
- Boxes need to be opened and marked with your last name
- You must take your candles with you when you leave; remaining candles will be donated.

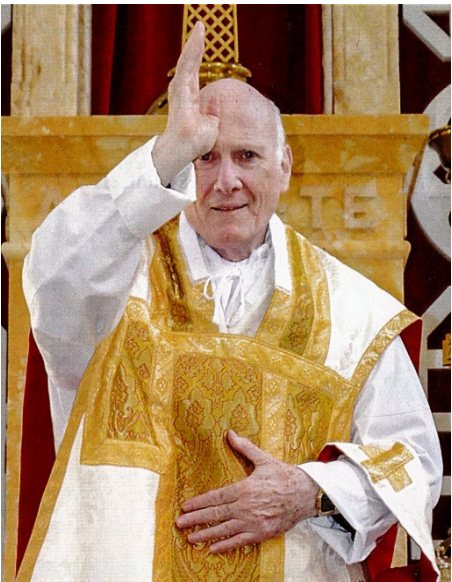
