Monday, May 13 - St. Robert Bellarmine, Bishop, Confessor & Doctor, III Class, White

St. Robert rendered special service to the Popes in the years following the Council of Trent. By his controversial books he dealt formidable blows to Protestantism, while by his catechism, translated into forty languages, he spread the knowledge of the Catholic faith in all countries of the world. He died on September 17, 1621 and was canonized by Pius XI in 1930.

Having given up a prominent ecclesiastical position, he devoted himself to the education of poor children. He founded the Brothers of the Christian Schools, which soon spread throughout the world for the purpose of Catholic education of children and youth.

He died April 7, 1719.

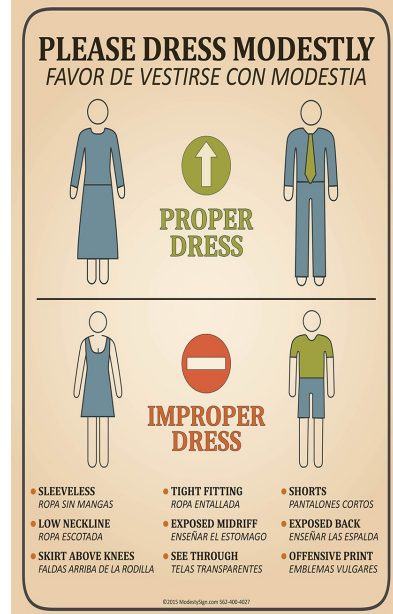
Bookseller request for Homeschool Book Sale
