To them does Rome owe its true renown, for it was under God's providential guidance that they were led to make of the capital of the Roman empire, sanctified by their martyrdoms, the center of the Christian world, whence should radiate the teachings of the Gospel. St. Peter was martyred on a cross upside-down under Nero in 66 or 67 and buried on the hill of the Vatican. St. Paul was martyred on the Ostian way; Basilicas bearing their names stand over these sites.

#### \*\* Confirmation Changes \*\*

Effective June 2024, per Diocesan policy, youth may receive the sacrament of Confirmation, at the earliest, when they are in 8th grade and Confirmation preparation for youth receiving the sacrament is a two-year process, starting at the earliest, in 7th grade. Families must be registered and active (i.e. regular Mass attending) Mater Dei parishioners. There will not be youth Confirmations in 2025; youth who are in 8th grade in the 2024-25 school year may prepare to receive the sacrament in 2026. Youth who are in 7th grade in the 2024-25 school year may also register this year to receive the sacrament in 2026.

While more details about the changes will be available later this month, the office would like to inform families of important dates for youth who are preparing to be confirmed in 2026

<u>First Saturday classes:</u> Confirmandi and at least one parent must attend First Saturday classes held from 11:30-12:30 in the parish hall. Classes will be held the months of September & November of 2024, and January-May of 2025.

<u>Half Day Retreat</u>: A half-day retreat will be held at Carmel on October 26, 2024 & October 25, 2025. The retreat will run approximately 8am-noon.

<u>Baptism Certificate</u>: If you have a child who will be Confirmed in 2026, we suggest contacting his/her parish of baptism now to request a current baptism certificate be mailed to you (we need an original hard copy from the parish), so you will not experience any delays in getting your child registered by the August 31 deadline. Registrations can not be accepted without current baptism certificates from the parish of baptism.

#### \*\* First Communion Changes (Updated) \*\*

Effective June 2024, for families utilizing the Homeschool Preparation option, First Holy Communions at Mater Dei will be held during select Sunday 11:30am Sung Masses and select Feast Day 7pm Sung Masses. The remaining 2024 dates for First Communion are September 29 and Friday, October 11 (Divine Maternity). A maximum of 10 children may receive their First Communion at any given Mass.

Children must be minimally age 7 and in second grade by the age of reception, and families must be registered and active parishioners for at least one year. The parish also provides a catechism class option for second-graders to enroll in from October - May, in which they receive the Sacrament on the Feast of Corpus Christi. The registration process is also being updated.
