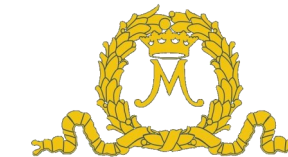

Henry II, called the Pious, was Duke of Bavaria in 995, King of Germany in 1002, and head of the Holy Roman Empire from 1014 until 1024.

Tuesday, July 16 - Our Lady of Mount Carmel, IV Class, White

In July 16, 1251, Our Lady appeared to St. Simon Stock, the superior of a group of Carmelites who had come to Europe six years earlier, and placed in his hands the habit which was to be their distinctive sign. Pope Innocent IV blessed the habit and attached to it many privileges both for the members of the order and those attached to it in some way by the devout wearing of it.

Founder of the Camillians, a congregation devoted to the service of the sick, whatever their disease, state, or condition, he died in Rome on July 14, 1614. Leo XII placed all hospitals and sick people under his patronage and Pius XI declared him the protector of all nursing sisters.

Friday, July 19 - St. Vincent de Paul, Confessor, III Class, White

Born in France in 1581, while still young he fell into the hands of Turkish pirates who carried him to Africa. Upon his return to France, he became a parish priest and chaplain to the galley-slaves. He was entrusted by St. Francis de Sales as spiritual director to the nuns of the Visitation. In order to help poor foundlings, young girls whose virtue was exposed to danger, and others insane, invalid, or sick, he founded with St. Louis de Marillac the Congregation of the Daughters of Charity, known also as the Sisters of St. Vincent. He died in Paris in 1660. Leo XIII proclaimed him the special patron of all charitable associations.

**** First Communion Changes (Fully Updated) ****

Effective July 2024:

Mater Dei will be transitioning to a **two-year preparation period** for First Communion.
- Those who intend to receive First Communion in 2024 should contact the office as soon as possible.
- **Those who intend to receive in 2025 or 2026 will need to register between August 1 and December 13, 2024.**
- Those who intend to receive in 2027 will be required to register two years in advance of the desired First Communion date.
A newly issued baptism certificate will be required for registration.
Children must be minimally age 7 and in 2nd grade by the age of reception, and families must be registered and active parishioners of at least one year.

Reception of the sacrament cannot be guaranteed for those who reside outside of the Dallas Diocese.

For families utilizing the Homeschool Preparation option, First Holy Communions at Mater Dei will be held during select Sunday 11:30am Sung Masses and select Feast Day 7pm Sung Masses.

The remaining 2024 dates for First Communions are September 29 & Friday, October 11; (Divine Maternity)

A maximum of 10 children may receive their First Communion at any given Mass.

The parish also provides a catechism class option for second-graders to enroll in from October - May, in which they receive the Sacrament on the Feast of Corpus Christi. Enrollment information will be available starting in late August.
