Monday, August 12 - St. Clare, Virgin, III Class, White

St. Clare was the first woman to practice the life of entire poverty taught by St. Francis. Placed by him at the head of a few companions at San Damiano, she governed her community for 42 years, thus ranking as the foundress of the Order of Poor Clares. She died August 11, 1253 and canonized in 1255.

The Church celebrates today with great joy our Lady’s immediate entry, body and soul, into the glory of heaven, giving praise to her in whom the Redemption was fully effective without restriction, since, before all the other saints, she was privileged to enjoy the resurrection of the body, following the example of the Risen Christ Himself. A great sign appeared in heaven; the Mass of this feast, introduced by Pius XII after the definition of the dogma on November 1, 1950, sees in the woman portrayed in the Apocalypse, clothed with the sun, the moon under her feet and on her head a crown of twelve stars the glorified Mother of God in the full radiance of her eternal glory.

Friday, August 16 - St. Joachim, *Father of the Blessed Virgin Mary*, Confessor, II Class, White

Desiring to associate St. Joachim with the triumph of his blessed daughter, St. Pius X transferred his feast from March 20, on which it used to be kept, to August 16, the day after the Assumption. In Hebrew the name Joachim means “preparation of the Lord.” The Gospel sets out the genealogy according to St. Matthew. The divine preparation was begun far back and runs through the history of the whole chosen people, to finds its completion in our Lady, of whom was born Jesus Christ. The feast of St. Joachim, like that of St. Anne, should help us to venerate all the righteous of the Old Testament, whose lives were passed in preparation and waiting for the coming of the Messias.

Saturday, August 17 - St. Hyacinth, *Confessor*, III Class, White

Called the Apostle of the North, St. Hyacinth was born in 1185. He was received into the Dominican order by St. Dominic. In 1218, he was made superior of the mission which the saint sent to Poland; from there, he traveled through Austria, Denmark, Scotland, and Livonia, his preaching confirmed by numerous miracles. He died August 15, 1257.

**** First Communion Changes (Fully Updated) ****

Effective July 2024:

Mater Dei will be transitioning to a **two-year preparation period** for First Communion.

- Those who intend to receive First Communion in 2024 should contact the office as soon as possible.
- **Those who intend to receive in 2025 or 2026 will need to register between August 1 and December 13, 2024.**
- Those who intend to receive in 2027 will be required to register two years in advance of the desired First Communion date. The full two-year preparation requirement will come into effect then.

A newly issued baptism certificate will be required for registration. Children must be minimally age 7 and in 2nd grade by the age of reception, and families must be registered and active parishioners of at least one year.

Reception of the sacrament cannot be guaranteed for those who reside outside of the Dallas Diocese.

For families utilizing the Homeschool Preparation option, First Holy Communion at Mater Dei will be held during select Sunday 11:30am Sung Masses and select Feast Day 7pm Sung Masses.

The remaining 2024 dates for First Communion are September 29 & Friday, October 11; (Divine Maternity) A maximum of 10 children may receive their First Communion at any given Mass.

The parish also provides a catechism class option for second-graders to enroll in from October - May, in which they receive the Sacrament on the Feast of Corpus Christi. Enrollment information will be available starting in late August.
