Tuesday, August 6 - The Transfiguration of our Lord Jesus Christ, II Class, White

Twice in the course of the year the Church celebrates our Lord’s Transfiguration on Mount Thabor – on the second Sunday of Lent in order to bear witness to His divinity as His Passion draws near, and again today to celebrate His exaltation in glory. Pope Callistus III ordered the observance of this feast for the entire Church on August 6 to commemorate the victory over the Muslim Turks near Belgrade in 1456, which was announced in Rome on this day.

Wednesday, August 7 - St. Cajetan, Confessor, III Class, White

St. Cajetan founded the Theatines, who endeavor to follow the manner and life of the Apostles. Trusting in God, they refrained from begging alms and waited until the faithful brought them help. His zeal for the salvation of souls caused him to be called “Hunter of Souls”. It was said that he was an angel at the altar and an Apostle at the pulpit. He died August 7, 1547.

Thursday, August 8 - St. John Mary Vianney, Confessor, III Class, White

Born near Lyons, France in 1786, ordained in August 1815, St. John Vianney was parish priest at Ars for nearly 42 years. His simple preaching touched the hearts of both young and old. Crowds flocked to the holy priest, who sat some days up to 16 hours in the confessional. Through his prayers, penances, and long years as pastor, he managed to revitalize a parish that had been morally and spiritually corrupt when he took over. He died in 1859

Saturday, August 10 - St. Laurence, Martyr, II Class, Red

St. Lawrence was the first of seven deacons attached to the service of the Church in Rome under Sixtus II. When he was called to deliver up the property of the Church in his charge, he showed to he persecutors a crowd of poor people. “Here are the true treasures of the Church,” he said,” they convert our alms into imperishable treasure for us.” As a reward for his daring he was made to undergo torture on the grill and died on August 10, 258, a few days after the Pope

First Communion Changes (Fully Updated) **

Effective July 2024:

Mater Dei will be transitioning to a **two-year preparation period** for First Communion.

- Those who intend to receive First Communion in 2024 should contact the office as soon as possible.

- **Those who intend to receive in 2025 or 2026 will need to register between August 1 and December 13, 2024.**

- Those who intend to receive in 2027 will be required to register two years in advance of the desired First Communion date. The full two-year preparation requirement will come into effect then.

A newly issued baptism certificate will be required for registration.

Children must be minimally age 7 and in 2nd grade by the age of reception, and families must be registered and active parishioners of at least one year.

Reception of the sacrament cannot be guaranteed for those who reside outside of the Dallas Diocese.

For families utilizing the Homeschool Preparation option, First Holy Communion at Mater Dei will be held during select Sunday 11:30am Sung Masses and select Feast Day 7pm Sung Masses.

The remaining 2024 dates for First Communion are September 29 & Friday, October 11; (Divine Maternity) A maximum of 10 children may receive their First Communion at any given Mass.

The parish also provides a catechism class option for second-graders to enroll in from October - May, in which they receive the Sacrament on the Feast of Corpus Christi. Enrollment information will be available starting in late August.
