Monday, October 7 - Our Lady of the Rosary, II Class, White

It was customary in the Middle Ages for nobility to wear crowns of flowers as “chaplets.” These crowns were offered to persons of distinction as a sign of reverence. Our Lady has the right to the same homage, and so the Church asks us to offer her a three-fold chaplet, or three crowns of roses, to which she has given the name Rosary. This feast was established to commemorate the victory at Lepanto over the Muslims on October 7, 1571, a favor due to the recitation of the Rosary.

Tuesday, October 8 - St. Bridget of Sweden, *Widow*, III Class, White

Of the royal house of Sweden, St. Bridget married Prince Ulfo, by whom she had eight children, one of whom was St. Catherine of Sweden. After the death of her husband, she would dedicate her life to religion and founded the Order of the Most Holy Savior. She died in Rome in 1373.

Born in 1541, ordained in 1573, he guided many young men in the way of perfection, and founded in 1574 the Congregation of the Clerks Regular of the Mother of God. He was a fearless defender of the Faith against the Protestant error in Italy. He died caring for plague victims in 1609.

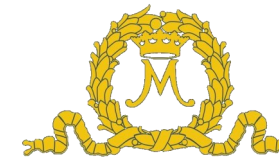

First Communion Class Enrollment

Mater Dei will sponsor a parish catechism class on Monday afternoons, 10/21/2024 - 6/15/2025, for students who wish to receive the sacraments of Penance and Holy Communion during the 2024-25 school year. The First Communion Mass for class students will be on the Feast of Corpus Christi, June 19, 2025. First Confession will take place prior to First Communion on a date determined by the class instructor.

Candidates must be at least 7 years old and in the second grade by June 19, 2025, to be able to enroll in the class. Candidates may only be enrolled by families that have been registered parishioners at Mater Dei for at least one year.

Enrollment Process

Enrollment for the class will be available through the Mater Dei office from September 2 until October 4. To Enroll, download the required form at the link below, then fill it out and email, mail or drop-off the completed form to the parish office: <https://materdeiparish.com/1stcommunion-class-reg-form>. Only the parents or legal guardians of the child may register their student for the class. There is a \$15 suggested donation per child to cover the cost of the books, with a maximum of \$25 per family.

Baptism Certificates

A newly issued baptism certificate must be provided to the parish office by December 13, 2024, for every student that is confirmed for class attendance.
