As we are reminded by the Gospel of this Mass, St. Andrew, the brother of Simon Peter, was the first Apostle called by our Lord. At Christ's call, he left his nets straightway and followed Him to become a "fisher of men." Little is known of St. Andrew's subsequent apostolic career. The old accounts of his martyrdom depict him crucified on two beams fastened together in the form of an "x" and contain beautiful passages on fidelity to Christ and love of the Cross; for this reason St. Andrew has become known in Christian devotion as the Apostle of the Cross.

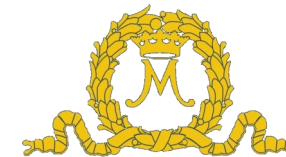

First Communion Registration 2025 & 2026

This is a reminder that the registration period for 2025 & 2026 First Communions is coming to a close on **December 13, 2024**. **This applies to all children who will be making their First Communion in 2025 or 2026, whether homeschooling or attending the parish class.** A newly issued baptism certificate is required for registration (hard copy with the parish seal), followed by submission of the online registration form. Both must be received by December 13. Children must be minimally age 7 and in 2nd grade by the time of reception, and families must be registered and active parishioners of at least one year. Reception of the sacrament cannot be guaranteed for those who reside outside of the Dallas Diocese.

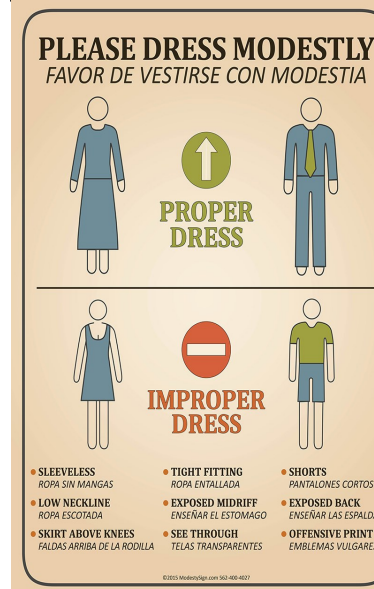


Women's Choir Volunteers

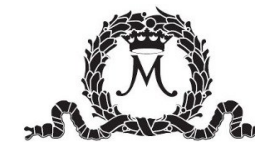
