Midnight Mass will be Candlelit. Families are allowed to bring candles from home!



#### St. John Wine Blessing

Boxed bottles of wine will be blessed on December 27, the feast of St. John the Evangelist. Boxed wine, with your family's last name on it, can be dropped off in the St. Louis room between **December 23 - 26** and picked up between **December 27 - 29**.

Wine is blessed on this day, because according to legend, St. John was served poisoned wine, but survived because he blessed the wine before he put it to his lips; the poison rose from the chalice in the shape of a serpent. In his happy memory, Catholics bring wine to church, which the priest blesses, turning it into a sacramental called the "Love of St. John." Bottles of the blessed wine are traditionally drunk or gifted at special occasions like baptisms, weddings and housewarmings. #### **Sacraments at Mater Dei**

<u>Baptism</u> - Please allow 1 month's notice for the Sacrament of Baptism. Parents must be registered parishioners of Mater Dei. For more information, please contact <u>secretary@materdeiparish.com</u>

First Holy Communion - Per diocesan policy, Mater Dei is transitioning to a two-year preparation period for First Holy Communion. Children must also be minimally age 7, and in second grade when they make their First Communion. Parents and children must be registered parishioners of Mater Dei, however, reception of the Sacrament can't be guaranteed for those who reside outside of the Dallas Diocese. Parents may choose to use the homeschool program, or the classroom program. A newly issued baptism certificate is required for registration (hard copy with the parish seal), followed by submission of the online registration form. Marriage - Contact the parish office to meet with one of the parish priests a minimum of six months prior to proposed date; preparation program required.
