Monday, December 9 - Immaculate Conception of the Blessed Virgin Mary, I Class, White, Holy Day of Obligation

Almighty God, having decided from all eternity to make Mary the Mother of the Word Incarnate clothed her with the robe of holiness and made her soul a dwelling worthy of His Son. That complete Redemption which, from the moment of her conception, preserved our Lady from original sin, must not be considered apart from our own redemption by Christ. Occurring in Advent, this feast heralds the wonders of the Incarnation, by which Redemption came to the world. This feast was instituted by Bl. Pius IX when the dogma was defined on December 8, 1854; the solemn definition, spurred by our Lady's appearance at Lourdes, was an assertion of the constant faith of the Church and a statement of the Church's precise belief in this matter.





First Communion Registration 2025 & 2026

This is a reminder that the registration period for 2025 & 2026 First Communions is coming to a close on *December* 13, 2024. This applies to all children who will be making their First Communion in 2025 or 2026, whether homeschooling or attending the parish class. A newly issued baptism certificate is required for registration (hard copy with the parish seal), followed by submission of the online registration form. Both must be received by December 13. Children must be minimally age 7 and in 2nd grade by the time of reception, and families must be registered and active parishioners of at least one year. Reception of the sacrament cannot be guaranteed for those who reside outside of the Dallas Diocese. * Email secretary@materdeiparish.com for more information.

Baptism - Please allow 1 month's notice for the Sacrament of Baptism. Parents must be registered parishioners of Mater Dei. For more information, please contact secretary@materdeiparish.com

First Holy Communion - Per diocesan policy, Mater Dei is transitioning to a two-year preparation period for First Holy Communion. Children must also be minimally age 7, and in second grade when they make their First Communion. Parents and children must be registered parishioners of Mater Dei, however, reception of the Sacrament can't be guaranteed for those who reside outside of the Dallas Diocese. Parents may choose to use the homeschool program, or the classroom program. A newly issued baptism certificate is required for registration (hard copy with the parish seal), followed by submission of the online registration form. Marriage - Contact the parish office to meet with one of the parish priests a minimum of six months prior to proposed date; preparation program required. Either the bride or groom must have a domicile in the Dallas Diocese and be a parishioner at Mater Dei in order to have a wedding ceremony at the parish.
