Pope St. Fabian was one of the first victims of the persecution under Decius; he died in 250. St. Sebastian was a Roman martyr of the beginning of the fourth century. Traditionally, he is the typical Christian soldier, faithful to his religion as to his military orders. He is the patron of archers and is often depicted as pierced with arrows.

Sacraments at Mater Dei

For Mater Dei Parishioners who have been registered and active (Sunday Mass attending) for at least one year.

<u>Baptism</u> - Please allow 1 month's notice for the Sacrament of Baptism. For more information, please email the office.

<u>First Holy Communion</u> - There is a two-year formation period which begins at the time of registration. Children must be minimally age 7 and in 2nd grade by the age of reception. Parents may choose to catechize their child at home, or enroll him/her in the parish First Confession/Communion catechism class. * *A newly issued baptism certificate is required for registration*.

<u>Confirmation</u> - Youth (7th - 12th grade): There is a two-year formation period. Registration will begin in the summer. Adults: Email the office for more information. A newly issued baptism certificate is required for registration.

<u>Marriage</u> - Contact the parish office to meet with one of the parish priests a minimum of six months prior to proposed date; preparation program required. Either the bride or groom must have a domicile in the Dallas Diocese and be a parishioner at Mater Dei in order to have a wedding ceremony at the parish.

Reception of the Sacraments can't be guaranteed for those who reside outside of the Dallas Diocese.
