Pope Cornelius, after a pontificate of two years troubled by a schism of the first anti-pope, Novatian, died in exile in 253. St. Cyprian, a former lawyer, converted and became bishop of Carthage in northern Africa. He loved the Church ardently and fought and suffered for her. In the thick of persecution he encouraged the faithful to face martyrdom and was himself beheaded in 258 on the day Pope Cornelius' relics were transferred to Rome.

Sacraments at Mater Dei

For Mater Dei Parishioners who have been registered and active (Sunday Mass attending) for at least one year.

Baptism - Please allow 1 month's notice for the Sacrament of Baptism. For more information, please email the office.

First Holy Communion - There is a two-year formation period which begins at the time of registration. Children must be minimally age 7 and in 2nd grade by the age of reception. Parents may choose to catechize their child at home, or enroll him/her in the parish First Confession/ Communion catechism class. * A newly issued baptism certificate is required for registration.

Confirmation - Youth (7th – 12th grade): There is a two-year formation period. Registration will begin in the summer. Adults: Email the office for more information. A newly issued baptism certificate is required for registration.

Marriage - Contact the parish office to meet with one of the parish priests a minimum of six months prior to proposed date; preparation program required. Either the bride or groom must have a domicile in the Dallas Diocese and be a parishioner at Mater Dei in order to have a wedding ceremony at the parish.
